Are You Ready to Launch into Life!

Transitioning into adulthood and the community beyond high school can be challenging for young adults living with ASD and/or developmental/intellectual disabilities and their families. Comprehensive transition planning can help to manage the challenges during this time and maximize the potential for each person to live a full and meaningful life.

The Launch Into Life! Program was developed at the Ability Hub in Calgary to help families prepare for and respond to key life transitions, and to guide the journey from adolescence to adulthood.



Continuity Care staff have been trained to offer this workshop series in Manitoba to assist young adults and their families in creating an *Individualized Transition Plan* and vision for the future.

The content is organized into 5 Domains which include:

- Health and Well-Being
- Communication and Social Relationships
- Independent Living Skills and Self-Advocacy
- Education and Employment
- Legal and Financial Issues

This workshop is aimed at young adults with disabilities and their families and we invite you to attend and participate in the sessions together. There is approx. 6-8 hours of content and we have delivered the sessions either on a Friday evening/full day Saturday OR three weekday evenings. During COVID, we have shifted to offering the workshops virtually using Zoom.

The cost of the workshop is \$25.00 per family and includes all materials.

The *Family Guide to Supported Decision Making* was born out of a workshop that we held on this very topic. Supported Decision Making can be quite complex and there is not one singular way to do this. Many families in the workshop felt, "if only there was a guide for this".

The *Getting to Know the Person Better—Activities and Interests Profile* was created to support the wellbeing of an individual with a disability and ensure that their support needs, hopes, dreams and interests were shared with those that would be involved in their lives and in their care. This profile could be helpful in situations such as:

- New staff in and out of shift staffed homes during the COVID-19 pandemic
- High staff turnover
- For new respite workers that may begin working with an individual
- When an individual transitions from the family home into a shift staffed home

Baby Boomer Café Corner




On Feb. 5, 2021, the Baby Boomer Café and Continuity Care community were saddened to hear about the passing of a special friend, Ben Friesen.
